# **Executive Summary**

The purpose of this engagement was to raise awareness about the District's vision for improving and, in the future, adding to the inventory of outdoor sport courts where demand exceeds current supply and to listen and learn from audiences regarding their knowledge of these facilities, how they are used, and preferences for improvements.

# **Participation**

Engagement opportunities included an online engagement survey, completed by 521 respondents, interviews with representatives from various sport user groups, and engagement with community groups.

# **Notification**

The District promoted the engagement opportunities through the District of North Vancouver website, District of North Vancouver online engagement survey site, outreach with leadership of each of the major sport user groups, presentation to community groups, area signage at various locations and social media.

# **Key Findings and Themes**

Online survey (June 15-June 29, 2023):

The online survey was promoted by creating a project webpage, displaying signage at various locations across the District, and through social media posts.

A total of 521 online surveys were completed. Of respondents, 79% were North Vancouver residents, and approximately 62% were District of North Vancouver residents specifically. Of respondents, 21% chose not to provide their postal code.

Of respondents, 56% indicated they play tennis, 32% indicated they play pickleball, 3% indicated they play ball hockey or lacrosse, 2% indicated they play basketball, and 7% selected "other" or did not provide a response. Participants could select more than one option. These percentages are closely aligned to the number of each type of court in the District.

The results of the engagement program supported the development of the draft Sports Court Strategy. Topline key findings include the following:

- Most online survey respondents indicated that their regular / preferred time of day to participate in their sport is 10am to noon (56%), and most play their sport all year-round weather permitting (53%).
- Pickleball and tennis players both identified the courts at Murdo Fraser Park as the outdoor courts they most prefer to use regularly, and 65% of respondents arrive at outdoor sports courts by car.
- Of online survey respondents, 77% are generally satisfied with the condition, maintenance and repair of existing courts and with their interactions with District Parks staff.
- Of respondents, 58% indicated that their priority for court time access was more drop-in time, compared to the ability to book courts (41%).



# Interview with Community Groups:

The District engaged with various community groups and gathered valuable insights and community-based advice and suggestions on sports courts in the District.

The community groups we heard from included:

- Parks and Natural Environment Committee (PNEAC)
- North Shore Advisory Committee on Disability Issues (ACDI)
- North Vancouver Sports Advisory Council
- North Shore Tennis Society and North Shore Pickleball Club

Comments from these groups helped inform the draft Sports Court Strategy's recommendations. Feedback heard can be summarized into the following key themes:

- Implement a booking system at sports courts to improve equitability
- Implement a fee for booking sports courts to contribute to funding the maintenance and construction of sports courts
- Maintain the existing number of tennis courts in the District as there isn't demand for more
- Explore and identify opportunities for accessibility enhancements at sports courts
- Carryout resurfacing, accessibility improvements (pathways, curb cuts, gates etc.), and maintenance improvements (tree debris, court surface cracks etc.)

# North Vancouver Recreation and Culture (NVRC:

NVRC carried out community engagement as a part of their concurrent Recreation and Sport Facility Plan for North Vancouver in June 2023. The goal of the plan is to help the City of North Vancouver and District of North Vancouver make decisions related to the development, maintenance and operation of outdoor and indoor sport and recreation facilities.

An online survey was available to both a random sampling of North Vancouver households, and subsequently to all residents Organized groups were surveyed and discussion sessions and interviews were held with a variety of individuals and groups in the community.

Of household survey respondents, 51% were District residents, and 49% were City residents.

The results of NVRC's engagement program have been considered during the development of the Strategy. Some of the key findings include the following:

- The majority indicate satisfaction with the availability and quality of indoor and outdoor recreation and sports facilities and amenities in North Vancouver.
- The service level for pickleball courts needs to be enhanced and more or better amenities may be required now.
- The service levels for multi-use hard courts (e.g. basketball), and tennis courts are currently appropriate

# Appendix A: Verbatim Comments

# Part 1: Comments about courts general condition:

I love the Myrtle Park lacrosse box where our ball hockey group meets and plays. That said, several of the boards have nails falling out of the boards and some of the boards are rotting. Please keep the lacrosse box — it is an essential piece of our community

Some resurfacing is highly needed. Asphalt is cracked, drainage is poor and vegetated edges can cause hazardous conditions

I play a weekly game of ball hockey with approx 10 people on Thursday nights at the Myrtle Park lacrosse box, under a recurring reservation organized by one of the players

Inter River is a fantastic park however the lacrosse box pavement is very rough and frequently damp in the corners. People play Ball hockey and Lacrosse on this court and its a trip hazard. The boards at this facility could use a revamp and should be higher on both the sides and the back behind the nets. Ball frequently goes out of play for most activities.

We need a basketball hoop in Norgate park that could be used outdoor any time during the year.

Basketballs and basketball nets for kids!

Many courts are overdue for resurfacing. Nets/backboards require refurbishing or replacement. Court are unlit or poorly lit.

Enhanced or new courts should be multisport courts (basketball, tennis, etc.), designed for all ages (e.g. I've found no adjustable basketball hoops to enable my 4 and 6 yr old to play on), WAY more covered areas for table tennis and basketball (and other more compact sports) and with enhanced design/colour for visual interest.

Replace nets, rims could be thin instead of very thick, which is unrealistic for competitive play. Having court lines would be better on most courts, instead of just cement

Outdoor pool!!!

They are pretty well maintained, but it's hard to say we need more just because of the infrastructure but sometimes it's very hard to get to a court, but the community is very accommodating.

The surrounding barriers to keep balls from flying out into the ocean and the pedestrian or cyclists are far to low. There have been injuries when people have retrieved balls from the ocean. Couple close calls with people thankfully. The sand quality is nice, needs a raking, maybe more added.

Would like a beach court or two in the DNV



Volleyball is one of your more popular sports in the winter, why not have it available in the summer on the beach. Other municipalities of multiple courts in one area, why do we not?

There is no courts currently in the district and only 3 in the city one being almost unusable

More beach volleyball courts in North Vancouver is needed. Thanks:)

We don't have any sand volleyball courts in DNV

More beach volleyball courts. Mahon park court is not leveled

Need fencing around courts so balls stay with players. At Murdo we are constantly stopping to return balls to other courts. This is such a potential fall hazard and annoying for good play.

Lacrosse boxes are in poor shape and they need new boards and fencing as quite a few of them are hazardous. Also, there should be at least one covered lacrosse box to allow for year round play.

Myrtle is a good size for lacrosse (regulation size), but needs refurbishment.

InterRiver is great for multi sports/ causal use, but is not regulation size for lacrosse

Noise and parking by pickle ball players is a problem. Tennis has not been a problem.

I came into this survey to suggest that North Vancouver should have more INDOOR or at least COVERED courts to make better use of them in the rainy season. For example, the courts near Dorothy Lynas are unused for months at a time and are exposed to the elements. If they were under a shelter, they would be used more.

It would be nice to have barriers set up between pickleball courts in Little Cates park, similar to Queen Elizabeth park

Little Cates Park (East Cates park) Pickleball courts — the existing space could easily accommodate 5 courts and would be well used. Most days in the week, the adjacent tennis courts are hardly used. Even on non---permitted club days— there are over 30 people throughout the day dropping in to pickleball with 4—6 tennis players in the same time period. We are very grateful for the courts and space provided thus far. It seems to make most sense to other users that the space could easily accommodate 1 more Pickleball court without affecting the tennis courts. Please consider.

Also--- as more young people are playing, please consider adding Pickleball lines inside 1 of the tennis courts at Indian River park (beside Dorothy Lynas school) or if tennis players do not like this--- make 2 Pickleball courts from one tennis court and gate appropriately

Thank you for your consideration

Some court are great (Mahon). Others are awful! (Institute)

The Murdo and Cates courts are cleaned daily of debris by Club volunteers and even squeegee dried to make them playable/usable for many more days of the year. That's not the case at Myrtle. The Myrtle courts need the branches over the pickleball courts trimmed back to reduce bird droppings and leaf debris. Regular power washing by DNV is necessary and appreciated.

Our club maintains the Murdo Fraser. Courts DAILY. WE clean, blow debris, squeegee and dry courts, weed, constantly to maintain this beautiful setting. Maybe we should charge the District for this service, since it is proposed that we get charged for its use.

Temporary fence at Mahon impedes one court

There is not one single regulation sized pickleball court in the District. Pickleball needs a minimum of 8--10ft around the outside of the court. Putting 4 pickleball courts on a tennis court is not regulation size and the amount of space to serve and receive deep balls is compromised. Same with sideline shots. If all courts are being used there is often interference at the sideline between players from adjacent courts.

The District should consider moving the pickleball courts at Murdo Fraser to the most easterly end of the tennis area. Give tennis back their practice wall and create new regulation sized pickleball courts at the East end away from the houses.

Some are great some just ok

Need divider between courts like the one in Delta, Charlmar Park

There needs to be more soundproofing for neighbors. It's causing problems, as pickle ball is admittedly, an annoying, high noise producing sport. Residents around Murdo Fraser would benefit from improved soundproofing around their courts. I see that some has been added, but it's not sufficient.

Just need more of them.

More courts need to have proper surfaces. The existing courts need more maintenance such as keeping the surfaces clean and repaired.

The areas around the pickleball net posts at Murdo Frazer are badly cracked and any frost will cause them to deteriorate further. They need to be fixed before the winter. The pickleball courts at Myrtle Park are never cleaned, the trees around Myrtle Park courts need trimming back so the debris does not make the courts unplayable. The courts at Little Cates, Murdo and Mahon are cleaned and "squeeged" by club member volunteers. The district should power wash or clean the public courts more often.

There are too few pickleball courts to service the demands in the community. We need a pickleball HUB with



multiple courts (12 plus) to host tournaments. The condition and upkeep is generally an excellent team effort between the DNV and players. We take pride in our courts and really appreciate them.

Need more courts

Nowhere near enough Pickleball courts for the amount of people wanting to play

The fence in place between the basketball court at Munro is dangerous

It would be helpful to have separators between courts if possible

Layout at Cates needs total rebuild to utilize space and adaptation of adjacent tennis practice area. Should consider covered areas for winter play.

Need a net at murdo and more courts

Little Cates Pickleball courts should have a sign on the gate re Pickleball hours 8AM --8PM, I recently had to ask someone to refrain from playing at 6:30 AM . I live adjacent to the Courts . I am an avid PB player .

The vegetation that overhangs the pickleball courts at Myrtle Park deposits debris on the court surface. We try to remember to take a leaf blower with us, but some pruning of the overhanging trees might help reduce this need.

At East Cates the courts do not have dividers which leads to a lot of ball interference and possible injury. At Myrtle the courts are often covered with leaves and sometimes myself and local residents have to bring equipment down to clean up the courts.

Need to cover the courts so they can be used when it rains. Also consider lighting for extended play time in winter.

Public pickleball courts need more cleaning, especially in the warmer playing months

Need water fountain nearby to the courts. Courts have not be cleaned or debris. Leaving equipment for the public to clean or dry the courts would be great. Need more separation (even light nets can do the jobs) between the courts

The courts I have used are generally in good condition. The addition of windscreens/sound baffles at Murdo has been helpful. Improved power washing, especially in the springtime is essential for safe play.

Need to remove fence at Mahon. Dangerous and interferes with play.

Murdo has two courts at the back and they are awful to play on.

Better visible lines at Institute please.

In the future would love to see 'open air' cover on some courts a keeping light rain off so we can still play and not slip. Such as a tent like roof

If we add more courts in the same location along with tables, chairs, space to BBQ, we can build an even stronger sense of community than the amazing ones we have at our existing courts.

The pathways and walkways need to be free of debris and clear of vegetation for safety of walking.

There needs to be plans for a dedicated 24/7 pickleball facility like there is for lawn bowling and tennis.

Shared courts (e.g. pickle ball/tennis; basketball/pickleball, etc.) compromises court conditions for everyone (see Mahon courts for a prime example). Safety is sometimes compromised. Future planning should plan for dedicated sports courts that meet accepted standards for size and safety.

Could use some new garbage bins nearby

Cracks in playing surface. Daily court maintenance is done by volunteers

Club members do most of the cleaning and maintenance.

There are marked lines at Institute but no nets.

There is insufficient capacity at Murdo. There can be 45---60 people ready to play but with only the 605 (sometimes 6) courts, huge waits. While the tennis courts might have a couple people. If that.

Little cates should have more courts

Mahon too close to basketball and skate park

Mrytle park courts have lots of debris on them

There is a shortage of Pickelball courts

It would be great to have more pickleball courts that are spaced correctly. Most of them have fences (or lack of fences) that seriously interfere with the game or that even pose injury risk to players.

It'd also be great to have more courts available.

My other suggestion is that the city put in signage that more accurately reflects how our community shares the courts. A lot of signs suggest/mandate a 30---minute limit if people are waiting. However, it's best (and most conventional) for all of us if you finish 1 game when people are waiting, then rotate out. (This keeps the wait times short and makes sure more people can get involved.)

A large complex is required to host a tournament

Don't like slope on Mahon park courts and noise of skatepark. Tempe court surface needs to be pressure washed to get mildew (slippery) of court surface



- 1. Please make sure correct measurements and space around courts. Sufficient space around all four side of pickleball court.
- 2. Get an expert in pickleball to help when developing more.
- 3. So much wasted space at Little Cates Pickleball courts, probably could have added 1 or 2 courts.
- 4. Also would be nice to have fencing between each court so balls aren't rolling everywhere like at Murdo Fraser and Little Cates.

if we advocate for more drop in times, that will cut the times that the club gets. Not sure this is a well thought out question

Institute court surface is quite rough

There needs to be more courts. Pickleball is the fastest growing sport on the North Shore so there is long wait times to play.

Myrtle Park is new, and sometimes the court is covered in leaves, don't mind sweeping it but it would be nice if there was a broom for doing so.

Pickleball courts not laid out well, ie. no fencing between courts, no covered outdoor courts, no lighting. I would suggest speaking to professionals when designing court to address court size, fencing, seating area, shade, etc.

Suggest repurposing outdoor hockey rink behind Delbrook for pickleball courts. Can resurface the existing surface which may be more cost effective than building new. Also covering can allow all year use as an option.

Need maintenance in winter - moss, leaves

Myrtle Park needs more debris cleared off regularly

Remove the basketball nets. It is dangerous and causes a lot of arguments between people.

we need a lot more pickleball courts and one you can book ahead in addition to drop in ones.

please change one of the tennis courts at delbrook and queens to pickleball! tennis is hardly ever played there

Cates is big enough for 6 courts

Institute could use a little TLC

Hit and miss facilities. Most pickleball courts are, but went to play friendly volleyball game at Mahon and the playing area is appallingly uneven and slanted. Have watched the lively games at Kings Mill but again, who designed and set that area up? Facing the wrong way!! Ball goes into water all the time, discouraging many novice players.

All courts deserve a washroom. The courts at Institute need attention.

East Cates could have fencing between courts to prevent balls from one court interfering with games on other courts

Power washing the courts is really appreciated. I understand the Murdo Courts are cracking and in need of repair.

They need regular cleaning and some crack repair

The Murdo and Cates courts are cleaned daily of debris and dried by Club volunteers to make them playable/usable most days of the year. I suggest that you a team clean the debris off the courts each week.

The Murdo court surface is cracking badly and need to be repaired.

Regular power washing by DNV is necessary and appreciated.

Lovely to have the new courts at Cates but they need to have permanent fencing separating the courts for safety. Currently there is a ragtag collection of stuff to prevent the balls from interfering other courts.

The courts at Murdo Frazer are in excellent condition thanks to a team of volunteers take on this job. DNV benefits completely from this service.

Pickleball courts are very good condition, also NSPC members clean up daily before club time

Volunteers from NSPC sweep and clean the pickleball courts throughout DNV, so that others can play or receive lessons or skill development. At times, we also clean and dry courts for immediate and later use if it's rained but its not too cold to play.

Murdo has some cracks which need repair.

Players help with DNV, CNV to maintain courts

They are great, thank you. There are absolutely NOT enough courts available.

It would be great to have permanent nets at Tempe where I also play.

More frequent power washing would make the courts more safe.

Open the 2 remaining empty courts for PB at Little Cates Park

Lights at Mahon park could be good

The sixth court at Murdo Fraser should be permanent with a fence between the two courts and adequate envelope.

Add pickleball lines to lacrosse courts

Need to paint court lines for basketball at Draycott park court, need to add a pickleball court to Westover park in



Practice tennis area that is not being used for anything

Murdo Fraser court surfaces are looking a little run down.

The layout of the courts at Little Cates Park is odd and there should be some barricades installed to prevent balls from rolling too far! the fence at Mahon Park between the courts and the basketball courts is in a dangerous spot.

Need more, proper courts, like Kitsilano. Converting lacrosse boxes or tennis courts isn't going to work.

Murdo Fraser is maintained by Club members on a near daily basis. Scheduled power washing by the district would be appreciated.

Tempe pickleball is not listed as a park but is extremely well used. It's cracked and should be cleaned more frequently.

Inter river park should be upgraded by adding much higher backboards/fencing and side fencing so the ball doesn't go out of play so easily. We often play at the westhill hockey box in port moody. If you compare the 2, westhill had about 3 times the height of fencing behind the nets and double on the sides of the rink. Something like this would be ideal.

Please raise the boards (slightly) And PLEASE RAISE the fencing —the amount of balls that go over the fencing when we play is due to the fence's low height — either fence height increase or netting

It would be amazing to add a roof to one of the existing locations (Inter River) or to add more rinks. I would personally invest to help the project as I think Outdoor Roller Hockey is wonderful for the community and the mental health of young people in regards to getting outside, breathing in the mountain air while exercising at a high level, and socializing with friends.

The court that looks like it, maybe for hockey and the basketball court (both at Kirkstone) are nice, but I would consider maybe changing to a more smooth concrete, and it would be really cool if you got a local artist or multiple local artists to do a mural there on the huge green fence that surrounds it. Also if we are talking about skateparks, stop covering up the art there. I understand if it says something offensive or violent, but if it doesn't, then it doesn't effect anyone. Maybe if you want more control of what is painted there you could hire people to put some art you commission, like it would be cool to use it as an opportunity to show some indigenous and/or queer artist, work there. Most of the time, affecting anyone and covering it up does nothing for the community that uses that space.

Add some fields/futsal courts!!

Would love to see some covers over smaller courts for all weather playing if possible

Some courts are in need of relevelling and resurfacing, which puts pressure on the better courts (many users trying to get on)

I think most of the courts need some repair. Karen Magnusson and Westover have cracks in the court surface. Courts could be cleaned more regularly or a broom on site to sweep up debris

Newly surfaced in 2022, Court 1 at Myrtle Park already has cracks on it which are increasing and courts 2 & 4 and some of court 1 hold a lot of water after it rains because the surface is not even. This should be under warranty with Tomco.

Tennis nets should be maintained more regularly

We're very happy with the state of the courts. The only thing missing is a bench at Garibaldi Park. Little cates and McCartney park has nice new benches.

McCartney Park was in terrible condition for a long time before being resurfaced.

- 1. Fences should go all the way down. Ball often goes out through under fence
- 2. Paint on the court for consistency of play (important to tennis as ball should bounce consistently unlike soccer)
- 3. Net needs "middle belt".

The new surfaces and nets on McCartney and Myrtle courts are wonderful

Myrtle Park courts have a fair amount of pooling of water after rainfall.

Generally pretty good, but occasionally — litter, leaf debris. Some are in good shape but others need additions/upgrades and a few are in tough shape.

Some courts need more regular maintenance. Lighting for evenings can extend play time and access.

Regular cleaning needed,

Better fencing and spacing of courts

In the fall and spring they need to be blown clear more frequently.

We need more courts with outdoor lighting so as to be able to play in the evening. Court surfaces need to be updated so as to be safe, quick drying and remove cracks and mosses which are found in some locations (Cloverly, Derek Inman, Princess Park)

Yes taking too many Tennis courts for Pickleball

The District needs to invest in more doing and less studying

The outdoor tennis courts are generally in poor condition although playable. Most need resurfacing. Many have inadequate benches, overgrowing foliage, gaps in fencing at ground level. A new flat playing surface is the most



important aspect with a net at right height but the other problems are material too. Also there should be nightlit courts for evening after dusk play — in spring and fall it gets dark early; in winter the days are longer but it can too too hot to play midday —afternoon, so night play would useful then too.

Please have a very large sign (current sign is small enough for people to ignore), that dogs and kicking soccer balls onto the nets are not allowed.

Like to see Dorothy Linus courts upgraded

Please please please put some benches in the Garibaldi Park tennis courts. There is nowhere to put your items and to put your leg up to put on support braces etc.

Some courts are cracking, and it would be great to have access to brooms or similar equipment to clear debris from courts before play.

The Facilities crew for the District and City of North Vancouver are working hard to keep the tennis courts in good shape; however, there are quite a few that are in rough shape and really need serious attention before they become dangerous and at risk to the public for injury. So glad to be a part of the Court Ambassadors team that are working hard with the District/City to keep our courts safe.

Some courts are better maintained and therefore are very busy. If all courts were well maintained there would be more courts played. There should be benches and garbage bins on all courts. If courts were covered — even seasonally there would be much more use.

Some courts get slippery with with moss after wet weather.

They're well taken care of

Need more facilities like lacrosse and tennis courts

More tennis hitting walls

Please improve Cloverly & Lynn Valley courts. I'd love to see more lit courts also

Eldon Park tennis courts need to be resurfaced

Wind screens at Murdo Park

Although we see parks crews, they often do not sweep the courts clean of leaves, pine needles, etc. Gas leaf blowers and weed whippers are very noisy, polluting and distracting when trying to play/enjoy a good game.

Generally well maintained. Nice to keep tennis playing surfaces clear of leaves, needles, etc.

Some surfaces could use maintenance and resurfacing. Eg Karen Magnusen tennis courts are great except for the surface, which is dated. Please resurface these. I have a suggestion about surfaces: develop more variety of surfaces, such as fake grass, fake clay. The district and city can charge a small fee for renting these by the hours with the simple installation of a coded lock. I lived in Melbourne for 4 years and this works excellently there. I would pay to use different services and to reserve times. But this should not come at the expense of freely accessible courts, which is one of the great things about tennis in metro van. Keep the sport accesible!

More courts, usually too many people waiting specially between April and October.

Karen Magnussen courts need resurfacing

There are some courts that need surface upgrades — some have raised cracks which can increase risk for injury Some courts need some real attention as their condition is quite poor. Courts need to have leafblower applied regularly. Perimeter of many courts need an arborist to trim back overhanging limbs.

Some courts are in excellent shape and have just been resurfaced and new nets installed while others are in poor shape and don't seem to be maintained like Cloverly. This means all the good conditioned courts are super busy

It would GREATLY help properties with multiple courts, if there was a sign—up system for those waiting for a court. For example, at Murdo Frazer, there is often confusion or conflict when determining who is waiting for which court. A system is needed where anyone who waits is to sign up in one spot. It would eliminate any further confusion and conflict. This would be helpful anywhere that has more than 2 courts.

Also, at certain times in the year, there is debris on the courts, such as leaves. It would be very helpful if there was maintenance where the debris is removed.

Sometimes there is wait times. Also that would be nice if there was applications to find available courts and tennis partners.

Washrooms, lighting for nighttime play

West Vancouver Courts are by far the best options for playing tennis, even though I live in upper Lonsdale, because the condition of the nearby courts have been poor for several years now.

Needs painting and thorns cut back

Conditions in the Spring/Summer months is generally quite good but in the Fall/Winter months the courts that have nets and are playable year round are not in good condition. Those few courts available for play in winter need to be, periodically cleared of debris and checked at least once every week or two. Players will squeegee the courts before play but the debris needs to be removed.

Ok the kirkstone para, the banch of the first court need to be on the middle of the side because When you run a ball you can crah with the banch

Some courts are in good shape. However, in general, most of the courts are not lighted in the evening, outdoor courts are full of debris during the fall and winter seasons. Safety issues need to be addressed: some of the courts have continuous cracks in the same area due to poor drainage and plants actually grow on these cracks. Pools of water are often formed in outdoor courts as the courts are not levelled. Slippery courts are risks of



bodily injuries for the players. Overgrown trees adjacent courts hung over courts, risk of falling branches/trees hurting the players.

# Always difficult to adjust net height

Some courts need some repairs and there should be benches or chairs at all courts for resting. The courts should be regularly blown to remove leaves and debris from adjacent trees and shrubs. Gates should close properly and not have space under which balls can roll.

Hard to answer the question about satisfaction with condition, maintenance and repair as some courts are good, some are not so good, some are downright terrible.

Evelyn Park courts condition is terrible --- but Westover is great

Some of the courts need resurfacing, which I know is being done.

Please put garbage cans on all courts -- many people leave tennis ball containers and lids lying around.

More permanent washrooms a la Murdo Frazer, Eldon Park. Cloverly washrooms are non---existent.

Grousewoods courts need repair. Prospect courts get puddles that take long time to dry after rain. Courts surrounded by trees get leaf and stick debris that make them unplayable without blowing or sweeping clean.

Lack on investment in re---surfacing is a problem. It drives down interest and makes it more challenging to attract newer practitioners.

I play regularly at Grand Boulevard. Right now the nets need attention. However, they're usually fairly well maintained.

Condition varies among courts, overall maintenance needs improvement on overgrown shrubs and trees, spreading debris causing slips and possible bodily injury, some court surface are cracked for long time and no action from District after reported.

# Part 3: General comments about outdoor courts in the District of North Vancouver

Norgate park is very big and has the capacity for a basketball hoop. With sooooo many building being built in this area we need an outdoor basketball hoop.

Draycott playground needs to be updated. Design is terrible!

The Shipyards has shown us that more covered facilities and spaces are needed on the North Shore, considering our climate.

Should be more multi---use. I see Tennis courts which are hardly used that could be used for basketball, pickleball, etc.

Beach volleyball is one of the fasted growing sports, you have a top 5 women's team in the world from Canada, and Canada's biggest tournament the Vancouver Open. Its time to grow the sport. In door volleyball is super popular in the winter courts are hard to get. It could be the same if you opened up more courts.

Do not mix sports on a court as the lines make it too difficult to play. If Pickleball courts are fenced then younger players can play and if courts are empty small children can ride bikes. The net needs to be off the ground for proper Pickleball play. The Indoor set ups are terrible with all the court lines — always need different balls as the colour of the pickeball lines vary — even between courts at the same facility (Lions gate)!! — annoying.

Beach and/or grass volleyball courts would be very well used. Currently, the two beach courts at at King's Mill (CNV) see 3x more demand than supply.

The lacrosse boxes are in very poor condition. They need a proper surface, boards and lighting. Having one surface with a roof would draw a lot of interest during the rainy season.

Pickleball is far more invasive a sport acoustically than tennis. Please take this into consideration when locating courts. Also pickle ball players seem to drive whereas tennis player often walk. Please provide off street parking for pickleball court locations, as residents can't park in front of own homes.

We need more courts and the NSPC needs more court time. People play most often when the club has booked court times because then there are lots of people to play with and it's social.

As we can only play after work on weekdays, lighting would be very nice for winter/shoulder seasons.

Love seeing more and more young people coming out to play pickleball. Any way we can facilitate inter generational activity and understanding is important for community capacity and acceptance

DNV has the best courts on the NS but all are compromised. Most important considerations for ideal playing conditions are: N--S orientation of courts, fencing between courts; adequate playing envelope around court, dryness of surface.



# Not enough courts and lots of players

Yes, the concept of shared dual purpose facilities ie multi lines painted on tennis courts may sound like a frugal attempt to higher utilization of existing courts, however it has an opposite effect in that no one from either sport wants to use them. Construct properly designed sport specific courts and they will be used all day long. The amazing growth of Pickleball will guarantee this. It is already very busy with 50+ people packed into Murdo on most days.

Tennis is very fearful of losing any and all existing tennis courts. Suggest new regulation sized courts for pickleball instead of conversion of tennis courts. We want peace, not hospitality.

I enjoy playing at murdo. Great facility but parking could be an issue esp in emergency situations. A large sports park to include many rec activities would be wonderful. Little Cates is great, too!

I really appreciate how dnv staff responded to the need for permanent pickle ball courts east of the Seymour, resulting in 4 new courts at little cates and 2 at myrtle. I do believe little cates could easily accommodate 2 more pb courts on the existing 4 court footprint with little additional cost/effort and hope this will be considered in the future

Love what you have done for Murdo. Would love to see more like this.

We are in desperate need of more Pickleball courts throughout the district. The sport is absolutely exploding and access is extremely limited. In particular we could use courts with light for evening play, PLUS indoor courts. BUT any new indoor courts should be built with OUTDOOR court surface. Using indoor gym space on wooden floors is completely different. Rather, we need dedicated indoor courts with an OUTDOOR surface. These courts could be within a facility or enclosed in a bubble.

The Pickleball courts in DNV really need fencing around each court (the Rotary pickleball courts in Comox are a prime example). All the courts ideally should have a larger playing envelope on all sides to prevent accidents and they need a quick drying surface. Orientation should be North---South to prevent the sun impacting play and make the courts virtually unusable at certain times in the summer.

Please can you add more courts in areas where the pickleball courts are not too close to houses (300m plus) and add lighting to existing courts. We DESPERATELY need indoor courts. The pickleball community is more than happy to help finance this if we can partner with the DNV.

Lights and cover pickleball courts

Woeful considering how much we pay to live here

Whoever put the temporary fence in at Munro obviously doesn't play sport, it's dangerous

Ability to book in advance would accommodate working people and people with families.

There needs to be incentives by the local municipalities to allow for the private development of facilities. Canlans Ice Rinks is a prime example.

I notice that i would answer a few questions differently based on the supply and demand of courts. Pickleball is growing so fast and currently getting court time is the hardest part. So going to spaces with lots of courts is more pragmatic to get court time, but as the pb community grows and skill levels stratify......people will seek smaller groups and build their own communities and likely seek smaller spaces to play within their own groups and skill levels. And as more courts become available, people wont be fighting or thinking about which court would give them more playtime as they would seek courts closer to their homes and lean on other preferences.

Also booking time is the current best option during poor weather to guarantee court time indoors. Id love to do a drop in more often if it wasnt such a difficult spot to get my hands on. So many times ive booked courts just to hold the space but if more courts were available for drop in, i wouldn't feel so pressured to lean on a guaranteed booking if knowing drop in is always available.

Outdoor doesnt necessarily reflect indoor rationale but just to give you an idea of how supply and demand makes pickleballers go a little nuts over court time.

The selections above do not account for the fact that Pickleball players often show up/ drop to play with others to pleople and do not necessarily bring partners. The club play in North Vancouver allows that. Purely Bookable courts require you to bring a foursome. There are gray areas in between and you can look at how play happens in Vancouver on courts like Queen Elizabeth, where courts are not bookable, but usage rules require rotation and allow for players to rotate in.

Tennis always empty so why not more pickleball courts

Pickleball courts are very busy. 80 people on 6 courts on a Saturday morning! Need more!

Pickleball courts are critically under---represented relative to the already large but still rapidly growing numbers of residents playing the sport. Pickleball courts have a small footprint, low capital cost and high intensity use compared to all other major sports in the District. A use survey of the tennis vs pickleball courts at Murdo Fraser would illuminate the incredible discrepancy. If the District built a new 4--6 court facility every year for the next five years, you'd still be playing catchup and the local pickleball community would still be underserved. And indoor opportunities are an order of magnitude worse!



There are too many empty tennis courts at all times of the day, but there are players waiting on pickleball courts for an empty court.

Considering the popularity and growth of pickleball and the fact the sports is accessible for all ages, it would great if additional outdoor (and indoor) courts could be added as they are heavily used. Thank you very much for providing and continue to provide great facilities.

I would love to see more pickleball courts at Murdo Frazer (maybe using one tennis court) as there are often big lineups to play pickleball on the existing courts, while observing many empty tennis courts.

I am grateful for DNV's support for pickleball and hope that it will continue to grow as the playing population grows. I could imagine seasonal covering systems adding to the playability especially in shoulder seasons ( and through the winter for those who are hardier than I am.

There are too many tennis courts and not enough pickleball

Thank you for what we already have access to!

If you haven't spent time at the existing pickleball courts, do it. See the community we have there. By adding more in the same locations, we can have challenge courts and beginners playing all together.

There needs to be a dedicated pickleball facility. So many other communities in BC have them. Lines on tennis courts all over the district provide no "community" feel. There needs to be a dedicated facility like the district provides for lawn bowling and tennis, ice hockey, soccer table tennis for example.

Present courts are much appreciated. Please plan for dedicated courts rather than shared courts.

Please don't start charging for outdoors court usage, that would be a real bummer for everyone.

Could use more pickleball courts. At Murdo Fraser the demand for pickleball is much higher than tennis

The proportion of time allocated to the flying club at Inter river park seems disproportional to the number of people using the fields compared to other sports needing space. Do they need manicured fields kept open for so much time, a large part of which there is no one there. I agree that they deserve a place to fly, but maybe there can be better sharing of the space.

Please, please, more courts. Current ones ar very crowded and over used.

Please add bike racks at Murdo.

Too many permits allowed on current courts. They have permits during the best times during the days. We need more courts for this growing sport. District has not been proactive. Would be amazing to have a removable bubble at murdo similar to west van tennis. Murdo tennis courts are underused. More pickleball courts make sense there

The pickleball courts are heavily used throughout the day and in all seasons

Popularity continues to increase so would like to see adequate courts available

Convert more tennis courts to Pickleball

Need to be maintained and cleaned regularly.

I would love a way to play with others. For ex sign up to play online, round robin play times, etc.. the biggest barrier for me is finding play partners

Need to fix the one Pickleball Court in Mahon Park as the fence is positioned incorrectly (safety issue).

There are an insufficient number of Pickleball courts in the district. There should be signage placed on the tennis courts that Pickleball is allowed. All the residential tennis courts should have Pickleball lines also.

You should bring the sport named Padel Tennis to the District.

I couldn't do the ranking of other facilities (above) on my computer. I would like washrooms, bike rack and social seating areas as my priority for facilities close to pickleball courts.

Pickleball is one of the fastest growing sport for all ages, great exercise, a great way to socialize and super fun. One would just have to look on the internet to research the sport, view court layout and dimensions, barriers between courts, lighting etc.

District of North Vancouver should take this opportunity to review and act on the growth of the sport of pickleball. It would be a huge benefit to the community if they could create and build a top notch facility. With the youth involvement growing, it can be a fun and exciting venue for families as well. I have noticed a lot of gravel "fields" that are vacant and wondering who uses those outdated areas, I mean, who likes running, playing on rocks and gravel? I can only imagine the scrapes and cuts youths get falling on these surfaces, to say nothing about gravel in your shoes.

I would just encourage the parks department to look into creating an indoor/outdoor that is well laid out for multiple pickleball courts, they've done it for lawn bowling, skateboarding, tennis and other sports.

The pickleball courts at murdo are great! there are 2 courts on north side which could be be better utilized by taking out tennis practise wall and extending the playing surface for the two courts.

Need an outdoor pickleball complex with at least 8 courts.

pickleball is super popular. we are late 40/ and just started playing and everyone loves it. we need piclleball courts everywhere — more court times at rec centres and more outdoor courts, some that are bookable as they are always booked.

Please remove my first survey as I made a change in Booking Courts.

An ideal location for pickleball would have a larger number of dedicated pickleball courts (12---16, 24?). This would be an ideal situation for players at all levels to be able to come and play. And, could be used to host tournaments. Unlike tennis, Pickleball is not a sport where 2 or 4 people "take over" court. People usually rotated after one game and mixing players provides people to play against different level players.

A large number of courts in a central location could provide a gathering point for players.

I would be willing to pay a reasonable fee to play at that venue.

#### More needed!

The noise from playing pickle ball outside of designated times must be very annoying for home nearby. There are always people playing very early and very late, not abiding by the rules.

#### Like to see more

Not enough facilies. We, Pickleballers, are always involved in arguments with Basketball players. Try putting a few basketball nets on the tennis courts, and see what happens there. They do not belong together.

There should be some type of fencing between the courts and an adequate envelope around the courts. NSPC hosts play and makes the sport more accessible to new players.

More Pickleball courts are needed and many of the existing tennis courts are very under utilized.

Ideal Pickleball playing conditions consist of N--S orientation of courts, fencing between courts, adequate playing envelope around court (8+ feet behind and beside the court), good condition of the court surface. By hosting play, the NSPC makes the courts more accessible to new---to---pickleball players and provides for more competition for better players.

# Need adequate parking

Pickleball is one of the fastest growing sports in North America. It's a very social, inclusive sport that is suitable For all ages and abilities. It would be wonderful if facilities could be provided to accommodate the growth and interest in this sport.

Most of the tennis courts could be utilized by pickleball players between 9am and 4pm, Monday through Friday without inconveniencing most tennis players. Most of the courts I've played on did not have tennis players most days of the week during those hours but usually after 4pm and of course on the weekends.

Many more pickleball courts are needed for outdoor play. Would recommend sound barriers

Flying Radio Controlled Aeroplanes is NOT a sport, it is NOT exercise, and it is NOT a social activity.

It is a noisy expensive hobby that occupies three full playing fields at Inter River Park. Gas/glow powered planes are permitted to operate simultaneously. They are given exclusive access effectively all day during the week, and every evening during the weekends, with very few exclusions. The fields are often vacant, and when occupied it is typically only 2 or 3 pilots (maximum allowed is 5).

Compare this with pickle ball. It is a sport, it is healthy exercise, it is a socially engaging and occupies very little space. It is far less noisy than planes yet is afforded only a fraction of the resources of pickle ball.

Not enough outdoor courts available. Also covered courts would be ideal as players would love to play during the fall and winter months

I have observed some questionable behavior by some people in the pickleball community in regards to public parks particularly at Normanby. There is a large group that comes on Tues and Thurs mornings that makes everyone else play by their rules rotating courts and bullying people who are trying to play singles, or people who are playing casually with their families. The by law states that if people are waiting then you have to vacate and give other players the court after 30 minutes. This group is making people vacate after one game. Their sense of entitlement due to the size of their group is palpable and has prevented some novice players from coming when they're there. If you could make the signage clear that no one group no matter how large can rewrite the bylaws on their whim I and many other players would be grateful.

# More Pickleball courts are needed

Not enough places with 6+ Pickleball courts with permanent nets.

Would love to see improved availability and accessibility of indoor courts during the winter.

Myrtle Park is great, but missing basketball courts makes little sense for a park that size and well maintained. The existing lacrosse/hockey box is not in great shape, and could easily be replaced with basketball courts, or at least upgraded to support all three sports.

I appreciate having club times. I get to meet new people of my own level and I don't need a partner.



The rink behind William Griffen community center in the woods definitely needs to be redone. Adding working lights to that rink would be great too!

I would love to see another facility built that was year--round and was covered. The actual rink would be either standard NHL size (200" by 85") or International size (200 by 100"). Having a covered rink in the District of North Vancouver would be great for the youth and all ages alike to get outdoors and living healthier lives. District of North Vancouver Hockey Star Connor Bedard is a big time roller hockey player and his influence will undoubtedly have a lot of young kids putting on rollerblades and looking for a place to play.

You should have music festivals, and tons of murals.

Add some fields/futsal courts!!

People giving lessons without approval is not enforced

Pickle ball shouldn't be added to existing tennis courts. It should be added as an additional surface. The tennis courts already have very high demand.

Please don't remove any courts. Current courts could be restored if it is too expensive to build more.

Pickleball and tennis are not compatible and though they can be located in the same general area they should not be sharing the same surface or be in close proximity to each other. Proper and District wide signage should be used to indicate what the courts can or cannot be used for. There should be no shared tennis and Pickleball courts or multi lining.

Fees for smaller social groups with permits for using the courts, should be minimal or non existent as these groups have very small budgets which cover such things as balls and insurance and a small social amount but nothing else. If these fees are high these groups may be forced to disband and will just use the courts anyway but without the benefits of organization for partners etc. We already pay for these courts with our taxes. This was proposed several years ago and discarded for theses reasons. Larger organizations such as soccer may have the money but small community groups such as DCTC do not and have provided important local community life, health and connections since 1997. The same can be said for STANS. Many of our seniors are on fixed incomes and use tennis to stay healthy physically, socially and mentally.

Pickleball court expansion has been handled too exclusively and aggressively.

We would like to see tennis courts with lights.

The city should negotiate with schools to provide pickleball courts (paved lines only) on school property. Schools could utilize the courts during the school year, with local residents free to use the courts during designated hours (outside of school hours, weekends and evenings). This would solve the parking issues associated with pickleball as most school lots sit empty outside of school hours and would also provide some barrier to vandalism if the school facilities were being used on nights and weekends for pickleball. Schools typically have sports fields that provide some distance from housing reducing potential for conflict with residents due to noise. . careful consideration should be given to location for any new pickleball courts as the cost of relocating courts due to noise is significant. Repurposing outdoor tennis courts for pickleball should NOT continue. . young people do not have the luxury of playing tennis in a private facility and public facilities for tennis are extremely limited and quite costly compared to indoor community pickleball facilities .

Very valuable to the community and health. Please maintain and add to this great feature of our city.

It would be nice to have a broom at all the courts so we could sweep them before playing

By and large, think that the District does a way better job than the City of North Van in maintaining courts.

More playgrounds with washrooms

Stop replacing tennis courts with pickle ball. We need more of both so should not be a competition between them.

I see poor decisions being made when constructing new courts, please consult and listen to the experts playing these activities.. not only the engineers.

We need to preserve and add sports courts in DNV, not lose any more to the enormous construction boom in the district, in order to provide sports opportunities for the added population we hope to attract to the district

Maintain tennis courts as the rabid pickleballers are out in force!

Please invest in new dedicated PB courts and in new tennis courts and please maintain/improve the existing tennis courts .

Yes, do not try to add pickle ball to tennis courts.

please do not lump tennis and pickleball as one group when identifying space for courts. There is a real struggle with court use and damage from pickleball users lining tennis courts and weighing down the nets to play their game. It would be lovely to consider some court coverage from the weather in early spring and late fall before everyone moves indoors to play at the tennis center in North Vancouver. We need more enclosed all year---round use tennis and pickleball courts.

Multi lining of tennis courts for pickleball does not work. As a tennis player I strongly support building dedicated pickleball courts in non residential areas. Pickleball and tennis may be played on similar surfaces but that is where similarity ends. Sharing courts is very, very difficult and has caused conflict wherever it has been tried.

Any pickle ball court development should require community consultation and meet minimum distance from homes to prevent noise. They should not be allowed near homes which could mean requiring indoor facilities. Pickle ball courts should not be colocated with tennis courts. Pickle all courts generate a lot more traffic and a significant amount of noise, this should be taken into account for any new developments.

well there's no basketball courts, the only one is in mosquitoe and that's cnv i think.

Would advocate for 60min playing time and a way to record time someone steps on court

Please light grand Blvd & add pickleball courts to that location.

Pickleball & tennis can coexist. Might be best to have completely separate facilities. ie ONLY tennis at one site and ONLY pickle ball at another.

Pickleball courts should be added to parks without taking away existing tennis courts or practice areas.

Great to see kids using the tennis courts. Would like to maintain the existing courts for tennis players and not sacrifice for Pickleball.

- 1) If you did nothing else, resurface existing courts that are in poor condition It's less costly than building new courts and will help disperse people from more crowded courts.
- 2) Improve cleaning and maintenance Leaves/debris and water are the most problematic issues. Anything provided to help remove these from the courts would really help. Some regular die hard players will bring brooms and sometimes even leaf blowers to get rid of them.
- 3) Adding lights to multi---court locations would extend playtime hours in the day
- 4) Existing courts that don't have benches should have them for players to sit on either while waiting to play or to rest between games/matches
- 5) While I agree that there should be a garbage nearby (outside the courts somewhere for general area use), I don't think they are required inside the courts themselves.
- 6) Keep tennis courts for tennis. Pickle ball should have designated courts and because it is a loud sport, the courts should be far enough away from tennis courts and residential areas as to not be a noise disturbance.
- 7) One more indoor tennis facility like the North Van Tennis Centre would be amazing for the 6--7 months of the year when outdoor play is nearly impossible. This could also serve for more tennis program and lesson availability for all ages.
- 8) Create and maintain a North Van District tennis app or website that includes a map of all the tennis courts and facilities. This app could help players find courts nearby if some are busy as well as show the features of each of the courts (# of courts, lighting available, washroom available). I would pay \$10 a year for the use of this app/website. I bet others would also.

Generally the facilities and courts are kept up and and maintained, which is greatly appreciated!

Please stop turning them into pickle ball courts. Have separate courts for pickle ball.

Please pickleball and tennis separated. the two do not mix well.

picleball should get their own courts, not take over tennis courts

Some tennis courts have a very coarse and can be slippery. Debris from trees etc. is often on the courts. Lighting would make more courts useable for more hours. A few courts have uneven surfaces and allow water to pool which then takes a long time to dry.

There is a shortage of tennis courts. The better courts are often monopolized by 'regulars' If courts could be covered from the rain, that would be very beneficial as indoor courts, esp. outside of regular work hours are very hard to book.

Adding pickleball lines in tennis courts is quite distracting because the paint from the extra lines often results in tennis balls skidding unexpectedly.
